Bill was a faculty member at Oklahoma State University for forty-two years and was a long-time national officer of Mu Sigma Rho. Bill's energy and enthusiasm for the promotion of our discipline to students was second to none.

- Nick has nearly 150 publications on his CV. Several of these publications are centered on statistics education. Biomedical research is another area in which Nick has done a tremendous amount of work. In many cases, Nick involved undergraduate students in these publications.
